	Publish the accreditation decision on the website	After the National Accreditation Board makes a decision on Accreditation of a study programme (cluster of programmes) NCPA within a month: Publishes on the NCPA's website the materials of the National Accreditation Board meeting (presentations, minutes); Enters the information of accredited study programmes in the Register of accredited programmes placed at the NCPA's website. Publishes information on accredited programmes in mass media, reference books and Internet (Regulations, p.8 http://ncpa.ru/images/pdf/poloj_eng_2016.pdf)	

<i>Provide feedback on the accreditation procedures to the evaluated universities</i>	NCPA forwards to the educational institution delivering the study programme a copy of the minutes of the National Accreditation Board containing the information about the accreditation decision to the educational institution delivering the study programme; electronic logo of NCPA; the original of Accreditation certificate; (Regulations, p.8)
Design clearer follow-up procedures	The Regulations on Public (International and Joint) Accreditation of Study Programmes (clusters of programmes) in Part 8 «Follow up» (8.3; 8.5) makes provisions for obligatory follow-up procedure which involves writing the report by the institution on corrective actions within the stated period indicated in the accreditation decision.

	NCPA conducts two types of follow-up procedures depending on the decision of the National Accreditation Board on the term of accreditation: 1. The programme is accredited for the full term and recommendations for improvement are given. In this case, when the programme applies for the next accreditation in 6 years, the HEI in its Self-evaluation Report submits information on the implementation of recommendations given by the External Review Panel. 2. The programme is accredited for a limited term and recommendations are given for eliminating drawbacks and improving the study programme. In this case, in a specified period of time the HEI should submit a Report on the Results of Corrective Actions, which is reviewed at the National Accreditation Board meeting with the subsequent decision making. NCPA keeps a register of accredited programmes, which is a monitoring instrument for following up the implementation of the National Accreditation of Educational Programmes; - Register of Accredited Programmes). http://ncpa.ru/index.php?option=com_content&view=article&id=174&I temid=367⟨=en NCPA in advance notifies the HEI about the time of submitting the Report on the Results of Corrective Actions and provides guidelines for preparation of the Report (please see - Guidelines for Preparation of a Report on the Results of Corrective Actions (available only in Russian),

<i>Regulate follow-up procedures in the evaluation contract signed with the university</i>	Taking into account ENQA Board's recommendations, the accreditation contract signed with the university stipulates that the University adheres to the Regulations, where the follow-up procedures are outlined.
Set up a process to encourage follow-up demands	On the expiry of the full period of accreditation (6 years) an educational institution has the right to apply for re-accreditation. In this case the educational institution delivering the study programme is required to include the information on how the recommendations of the External Review Panel (if applicable) have been addressed by the programme. In case of a reduced term of Accreditation (less than 6 years) on the expiry of this period the educational institution has to submit to NCPA a report on corrective actions which have been undertaken to address the recommendations of the External Review Panel to rectify deficiencies and to improve the study programme. After considering the Report on corrective actions at a meeting of the National Accreditation Board a decision may be taken on extending the accreditation term or conducting an additional site visit by 1-2 experts for external evaluation. NCPA keeps a register of accredited study programmes, which serves as a tool for monitoring the implementation of decisions of the National

Increase the impact of external evaluation results in order to encourage universities to be re- evaluated	Accreditation Board. If necessary NCPA provides methodological support and consultations to help prepare a report on corrective actions. NCPA in advance (no less than a month) reminds the educational institution to submit the report on corrective actions and sends guidelines on preparation of the report on corrective actions to the educational institution. In case of a decision by the National Accreditation Board to deny accreditation of the study programme (cluster of programmes) NCPA sends to the educational organization delivering the study programme a letter with the justification of the decision. The educational institution has a right to apply for re-accreditation not less than a year after the first application. The application is reviewed according to the standard procedure. There is a section on NCPA's website which clarifies the impact and benefits for universities and programmes that undergo NCPA's evaluation procedures (8 Reasons for HEIs to choose NCPA). The results are taken into account when universities undergo state accreditation, and control and supervision procedures organized by the Ministry of Education and Science and the Federal Service of Supervision in Education and Science. The accreditation by NCPA helps HEIs to get more financing by way of increasing admission quotas for state-funded places in HEIs. There is also a briefing for the panel members on the first day of the site visit. Although there is no separate briefing for student members and representatives of labour market

	Establish an independent Appeals Committee	Taking into consideration the recommendations by the External Evaluation Panel (May 2014) new Regulations on the Appeals Committee were developed and approved (June, 2014). Accordingly, a new Appeals Committee, independent of the National Accreditation Board, was formed.
