ACHIEVEMENTS OF THE EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMMES

Quality of the delivered educational programmes

The teaching staff of the Faculty of Philology is formed of highly-qualified teachers who have academic titles and degrees including 14 Doctors of Science (33%) and 25 Candidates of Science (60%).

The Faculty was one of the first in the country to develop educational standards and to implement a two-step system: bachelor – master in “Philology”. Since 2013 the Faculty introduced distance education in “Philology”.

Students may undertake additional specializations in the frameworks of curricula: “Russian language as a foreign language”, “Forensic Linguistics”, “Foreign language (Czech)”, “Philological support of art studies” and others.

At present teachers of the Faculty developed and placed at the site of the University 139 electronic-controlled courses.

Employability of graduates

Employability of graduates is 92%. Graduates of the Faculty work with success in all humanitarian spheres of the region.

Provision of up-to-date education

Teachers of the Faculty make active use of modern pedagogical technologies based on multimedia. The Centre for Paleo-Slavic Research, the Center for Czech Education and Culture, Laboratory of Lexicographical Research named after V.I. Dal, Laboratory of literature local; studies, Regional Centers of Greco-Latin cultural linguistic function at the University. Results of work of these subdivisions are used in the study process and have scientific and cultural significance.

Scientific activity

During the period under review teachers of the Faculty participated in 415 scientific conferences included 24 international ones. Teachers of the Faculty published 1094 articles in scientific magazines and collected books.

For the last 5 years 50 monographs including 9 in foreign publishing houses were published. 9 study guides including 1 classified in ERO were also published. Teachers of the Faculty took part in on-stage performance groups in creating 33 books (25 of them are approved by the Ministry of Education, 4 – classified in ERO in philology, 1 – classified in Board of Studies of the University).

There is postgraduate training programme (at present 40 postgraduate students study there) and doctoral programme in “Philology”. There also exists Dissertation Council in doctoral and candidate’s thesis defense Д 212.166.02.

Material and technical base

The Faculty has material and technical base necessary for the study process:

- language room with multimedia equipment for foreign language teaching with a capacity of 25 students;
- 3 specialized classrooms for giving e-lectures in the e-learning system with a capacity of 120 students;
- media-centre which has no similar centre in other HEIs of Nizhny Novgorod for university television, study video content of multifunctional use;
- free access to the Internet from all classrooms of the Faculty.

The Faculty is provided with all necessary equipment for the study process by 98,9%.

Academic mobility of students

Based on the cooperation agreement with the University of Ostrava (Czech Republic) 78 students of the Faculty of Philology who study Czech language undertook internship in Ostrava and the same number of specialists in Russian philology underwent training at the Lobachevsky State University of Nizhni Novgorod.

In the framework of academic cooperation agreement with the Masaryk University (Brno, Czech Republic) since 2004 student and teacher exchange programme is implemented:

- students of the Faculty of Philology annually undertake month internship in Brno;
- students-specialists in Russian philology of the Faculty of the Masaryk University also annually undertake month internship at the University.

Just in 11 years of cooperation 207 students of two Universities undertook internship.

Since 2009 foreign students study at the Faculty.

International projects

Since 2013 students and teachers of the Faculty take part in competitions on academic mobility in the frameworks of international projects.

In 2013-2014 by the results of competitive selection on academic mobility in the frameworks of the projects ERANET-MUNDUS and ERANET-PLUS 3 students and 1 teacher of the Faculty of Philology gained the right for academic internships and education at the universities of Europe. The Faculty gave a 6-month internship to 1 Master student from Italy.

COMPLIANCE OF THE EXTERNAL REVIEW OUTCOMES WITH THE NCPA'S STANDARDS

STANDARD 1. Policy (mission, vision) and procedures for quality assurance

Compliance with the standard: **full compliance**

Good practice

Objectives and development strategy of educational programmes under accreditation are well-defined and accord with the mission and development strategy of the University.

Students, graduates and teachers of the departments who carry out training of graduates in educational programmes under accreditation are involved into the development of major educational programmes.

Systematic correction of objectives of educational programmes is made in accordance with road map.

The foundations of the quality assurance system were laid in implementation of the Tempus project "Overall quality management for universities".

Areas for improvement:

- Elaborate general opinion of administration, students, teachers and employers in the sphere of policy of quality improvement of educational programmes.
- Develop more critical relation to the content of educational programmes (take into consideration modern development trends of education in Europe).
- Provide participation in defining objectives and development strategies of educational programmes of all stakeholders (especially employers).
- Develop monitoring system of quality of educational programmes.
- Define opinion of all participants in programme implementation.

STANDARD 2. Approval, monitoring and periodic review of study programmes

Compliance with the standard: **substantial compliance**

Good practice

The Faculty conducts regular review of working curricula with account of coherence of the levels of education.

External experts (employers) are involved into assessment of graduates' competences.

Teachers carry out survey among students upon completion of a discipline.

Areas for improvement:

- Renew the content of programmes with account of opinion of students, employers. It is necessary to take into account students' and employers' opinion in developing working curricula and programmes of course units.
- Develop assessment criteria of efficiency of educational programmes in general and a more strict system of assessment of educational programmes based on regular survey of students and employers (including e-forms).
- Make the content of non-core disciplines with account of professional competences.
- Diversify forms of external assessment of educational programmes.

STANDARD 3. Assessment of student learning outcomes / competencies

Compliance with the standard: **full compliance**

Good practice

Flexible (7-score) assessment system of students' knowledge/competences.

Attestation results of students are brought to their notice and each semester is discussed at the meetings of departments and Board of Studies of the Faculty.

Since 2008 students of the Faculty of Philology participate in the programme of the Federal Internet-exam.

There exists a system of internal grants, competitions to support students' participation in research and international mobility.

There is a employment assistance system for graduates and interaction with employers.

Areas for improvement:

- Develop new forms of assessment of students' competences (e.g. by creative and group student projects).
- Expand the list of procedures of independent assessment of education results (e.g. by attracting teachers from other HEIs).
- Motivate Bachelor's degree students to participate in research projects.
- Motivate students to participate in international exchange programmes (e.g. Erasmus Mundus; bilateral interuniversity agreements).
- Put the Ministry of Education and Science of RF in for assistance in questions of international mobility of students and teachers.

STANDARD 4. Quality assurance of teaching staff

Compliance with the standard: **full compliance**

Good practice

The programmes are taught by a highly-qualified teaching staff with high percentage of teachers with academic degree (93%).

Increase in publications in peer-reviewed magazines from HAC list (95% in 2014) and RSCI editions (100% in 2014); publications in editions classified by Web of Science.

Examination activities of the teaching staff at the regional, Russian and international levels may be regarded as an indicator of external evaluation of a high level of the teaching staff.

There exists a motivation system of the teaching staff in the sphere of professional development, participation in research and international competitions / grants.

Areas for improvement:

- Develop a diagnostic system of the quality of teaching.
- Attract teachers from other HEIs including foreign ones.
- Improve the monitoring system of teachers' achievements.
- Use possibilities of internships in partner universities (based on bilateral agreements, different grant systems and others) as well as in HEIs of other countries based on international programmes (e.g. Erasmus Mundus, etc.).

STANDARD 5. Learning resources and student support

Compliance with the standard: **substantial compliance**

Good practice

The Faculty of Philology of the University has specialized classrooms to carry out training in accordance with the system E-Learning, and to organize an independent work of students (display classroom of free access, equipped with multimedia equipment оснащенный).

There is a free access to the Internet in academic buildings.

Study and information resources are accessible to all stakeholders.

Information requests of the study process in research are satisfied by a rapidly growing electronic database presented to the readers of the Fundamental library in a local variant (from server) and in online access.

Organization of distance education in "Philology" creates conditions to form barrier-free environment of education.

Areas for improvement:

- Improve the material and technical base (equipment in the classrooms).
- Improve conditions of implementation of educational process (e.g. amenities, noon recess for arrangement for feeding).
- Create social infrastructure providing access to quality education for students of different possibilities and age groups.
- Improve the feedback system with students in assessment conditions and organization of educational process.

STANDARD 6. Information system providing effective implementation of the study programme

Compliance with the standard: **substantial compliance**

Good practice

The University introduced a common data base of students (system "Student").

Teaching and learning materials are accessible in the local network of the HEI.

There exists a point rating system of attestation of postgraduate students.

The system Moodle has in place up-to-date study complexes.

Areas for improvement:

- Provide further development of existing information system.
- It is necessary to update information about educational programmes in the local network of the HEI.
- Place up-to-date teaching and learning materials in the system Moodle Moodle in all the disciplines of curricula.
- Work out the copyright protection system in a virtual space.
- Carry out benchmarking; provide monitoring of achievements of educational programmes under accreditation and their comparative analysis against other educational programmes.
- Use social networks to spread actual information (e.g. about competitions, grants, international programmes).

STANDARD 7. Public information

Compliance with the standard: **full compliance**

Good practice

The website is well-structured.

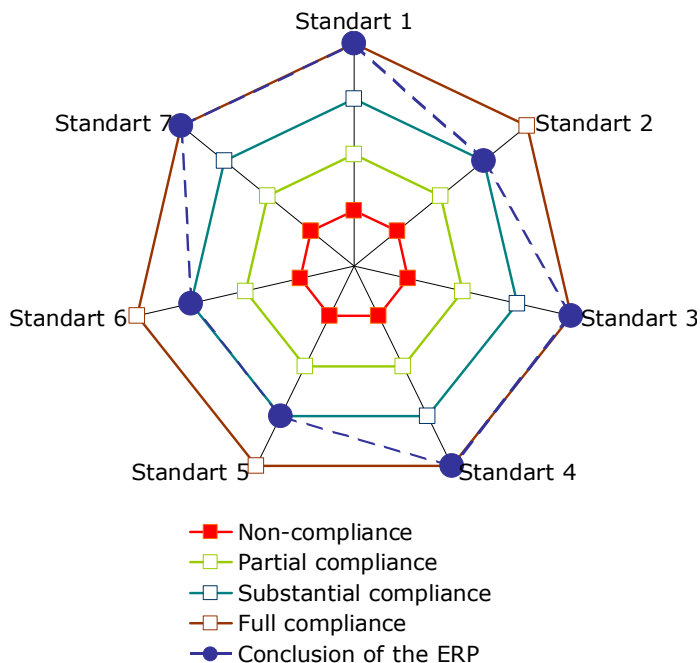
Use of different channels and forms (mass media, social networks and others) to inform public.

CONCLUSION OF THE EXTERNAL REVIEW PANEL

Based on the self-evaluation report analysis, documents and data submitted, interviews with the representatives of the professional communities, students, post graduates, doctor-degree students, staff and administration of the educational institution the External Review Panel came to the conclusion that educational programmes "Philology" (032700.62, 032700.68, 031001.65), delivered by the Federal State Autonomous Educational Institution of Higher Education "Lobachevsky State University of Nizhni Novgorod" fully comply with the standards and criteria of public accreditation of the National Centre for Public Accreditation comply with the standards and criteria of public accreditation of the National Centre for Public Accreditation.

Among main positive sides of educational programmes under accreditation the Panel points out a high qualification of the teaching staff, close connection with employers, providing conditions for internships and further employment as well as established scientific schools and correlation between pedagogical and research component of the teaching staff.

The External Review Panel recommends the National Accreditation Board **to accredit the educational programmes "Philology" (032700.62, 032700.68, 031001.65), delivered by the Federal State Autonomous Educational Institution of Higher Education "Lobachevsky State University of Nizhni Novgorod" for the period of 6 years.**
