ACHIEVEMENTS OF THE EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMMES

Quality of the delivered educational programmes

Quality of the educational programmes is provided due to admission of applicants with high passing grades (bachelor's degree programmes «Management»: in 2014 – 218; in 2015 – 231; in 2016 – 229, in 2017 - 238). Every year the University runs a competition of guidance papers that helps to improve methodological support of the educational process. In 2014 teachers working with the programme «Management» won the competition of guidance papers.

Providing up-to-date contents of education

Up-to-date contents of education are provided due to flexible response to requirements of the labour market, consideration of new achievements of science and educational practice as well as consideration of employers' opinions during annual renewal of the educational programmes. Questionnaire of students also helps to update the educational programmes. A system of cooperation with employers is based on contractual relations.

Teaching staff

By 01.09.2017 308 teachers have worked at the Institute. 253 of them (82%) have academic degrees, and 158 people (51%) have academic titles. 37 teachers work at the Department of Management and Public Administration, 34 of them are Doctors or Candidates of Sciences. Academic degree holders rate is 92%. The teaching staff corresponds to the Federal State Educational Standards of Higher Education.

A system of professional development allows teachers to improve their qualification not less than once every three years.

In 2014 – 2016 teachers of the Institute published 144 course books and study guides.

Teachers having working experience at enterprises and in organizations of Nizhni Novgorod are involved in the educational process. Teachers from other educational institutions, including the foreign ones, are also involved in the educational process. For example, Dina Williams, PhD, Director of the Enterprise Action Consulting & Training gives lectures on innovative entrepreneurship. In March 2015 scientific seminars for students and teachers of the Institute with participation of Allard van Riel, Professor of Economics of the Radboud University (the Netherlands), were held.

Independent assessment of knowledge

In 2015 students of the educational programme «Management» participated in the Federal Internet Exam for graduates of bachelor's degree programmes. In 2016-2017 the University participated in the experiment of independent assessment of knowledge MOOC-2016 and MOOC-2017. In 2017 assessment of residual knowledge of 3rd and 4th

year students on the disciplines «Entrepreneurship», «Philosophy», «History», «Economic Theory» was held.

Educational resources

The fund of traditional publications (training/methodological literature, periodicals) and dissertations constitutes more than 1 500 000 storage units, 680 000 titles and is universal in contents.

An electronic catalogue contains 25000 records, including bibliographical descriptions of books, educational materials, and articles from periodicals. Corporate electronic book stock is available on-line and represented by the following electronic libraries: Student's Consultant; Lan; Electronic Library of Theses; University Library ONLINE; MyiLibrary; Books Springer; Znanium.com.

Students have an online access to periodicals (East View, EBSCO Academic Search Premier, EBSCO Business Source Premier, EBSCO Newspaper Source, eLIBRARY, Elsevier, Oxford University Press, Sage, Taylor & Francis, Wiley Online Library) and to local databases (ConsultantPlus, GARANT, etc.).

Research activity

In 2015 – 2016 1 thesis for academic degree of Doctor of Sciences and 3 theses for academic degree of Candidate of Sciences were presented. $\,$

Students and teachers actively participate in research and development activities of the University. Positive dynamics in filing the applications is observed: in 2014 – 8, in 2015 – 21, in 2016 – 24, in 2017 - 26.

International scientific conferences, seminars, festivals of entrepreneurship and youth innovations «InnoFest», competition on innovative entrepreneurship «iGeneration: Innograd 3.0», international, regional and University Olympiads, interactive and business games, round tables, master classes are held.

Academic mobility of students

Support of students' academic achievements is carried out in different ways: scholarships, participation in the programme «Umniy Vnebudget», information sharing and help in preparation of documents for participation in scholarship programmes, etc.

Students of the Institute of Economics and Entrepreneurship have an opportunity to gain an additional qualification «Translator in Business Communication», as well as to learn English and Italian. Testing of the level of English proficiency is carried out at the wish of students.

Employability of graduates

Analysis of graduates' employability for 2012-2017 showed that more than 98% of students find jobs during three months after graduation.

More than 85~% of them find jobs connected with the received degree. About 11~% of graduates continue their education at the University.

International projects

More than 100 higher education institutions from 40 countries are partners of the University. 102 foreign students study at the Institute of Economics and Entrepreneurship. They came from Ecuador, Peru, Mexico, Cote d'Ivoire, Ghana, Zimbabwe, Norway, Pakistan, China, Algeria, and Italy.

Training, internships and improvement of qualification are carried out in foreign higher education institutions due to participation in international programmes. For the last 5 years 121 students studied in foreign universities due to the Fulbright programme.

Best practices of leading Russian and foreign universities are taken into account.

Good practice:

A student business incubator is used in the educational process and helps students to develop entrepreneurial skills. A rating system of assessment of students' knowledge promotes active educational and research activities.

The University participates in procedures of independent assessment of training and certification of pools of assessment tools.

Requirements of different groups of students including people with disabilities are taken into account in the educational process.

STANDARD 4. Student admission, support of academic achievements and graduation

Compliance with the standard: full compliance

Good practice:

A system of work on career guidance is effective.

The educational system is available for foreign students.

A support system of students' academic achievements and promotion of research activities is developed.

The University has many international contacts and participates in various international projects. Students are informed about the programmes of academic mobility.

Students' portfolios are published in the informational electronic educational environment.

Good practice:

Teachers are involved in development of educational technologies and electronic courses, improvement of their skills, and implementation of innovative teaching methods.

A competency-based approach is used and corresponds to the educational standards.

A rating system of the teaching staff promotes active research and educational activities. All achievements of teachers are published in their personal accounts in the informational electronic educational environment.

Teachers improve their qualifications.

STANDARD 6. Learning resources and student support

Good practice:

Informational, library, material and technical resources are improved.

Students have the opportunity to improve their entrepreneurial skills in the business incubator.

Almost all classrooms are equipped with multimedia technology and an access to the Internet.

A united information network, an information electronic educational environment are developed.

It is recommended to raise effectiveness of the system of collection and monitoring of information about the educational programmes (including development and discussion of specific recommendations for improvement at the meetings of the Department).

The official web-site of the University is informative, ergonomic and is well organized.

The public can get up-to-date and authentic information.

Information about the educational programmes undergoing accreditation is fully represented.

The web-site is effectively used by the educational institution for improvement of its public image and quality of the educational programmes.

STANDARD 9. On-going monitoring and periodic assessment of the educational programmes

Compliance with the standard: substantial compliance

Good practice:

Monitoring of opinions of students, teachers and employers is carried out regularly.

Employers are involved in periodical assessment of the cluster of the educational programmes «Management».

A feedback system with students and employers is used during monitoring and assessment of the educational programmes.

Procedures of monitoring and assessment are regulated.

Areas for improvement:

It is recommended to raise effectiveness of the system of monitoring and collection of information about the educational programme in relation to corrective measures in case of revealed discrepancies, deviances and suggestions of respondents.

Good practice:



Expert review of education quality is successfully passed; documents about certification and registration of the University in the Chamber of Commerce and Industry of the Russian Federation are acquired; procedure of certification in the European Organization for Quality is passed.

Nowadays, assessment of quality of the educational programmes is carried out with participation of the Chamber of Commerce and Industry of the Russian Federation, Association of Manufacturers and Entrepreneurs of Nizhni Novgorod Region, Committee for Economics, Industry and Entrepreneurship of the City Duma of Nizhni Novgorod.

There is a programme of corrective actions based on the results of external reviews.

Quick response to remarks revealed during external reviews is in place.
