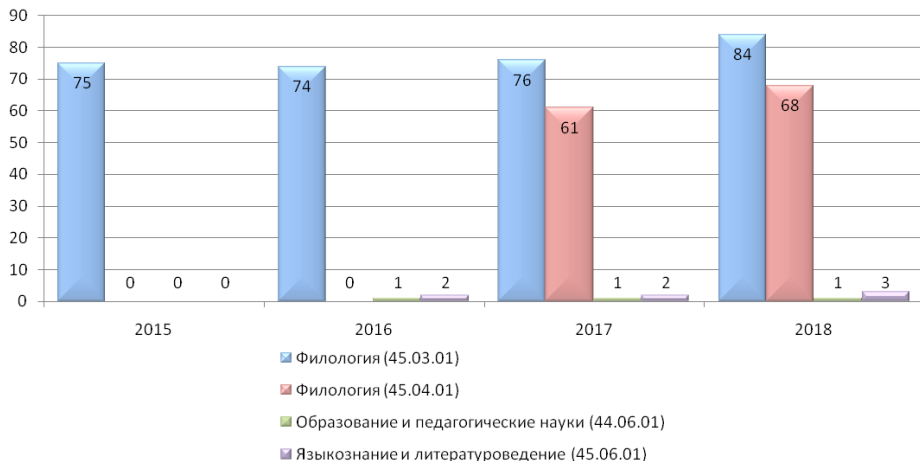

ACHIEVEMENTS OF THE EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMMES

Quality of the delivered educational programmes

Pushkin State Russian Language Institute has in place systemic quality assurance of education; it has well established and documented internal quality assurance system used for the development and implementation of study programmes.

There is a special unit at the Institute, which implements quality assurance policy – the Department of Quality Education. The Department is collaborates with deans, heads of departments and persons responsible for quality at every department.

The quality of study programme delivery is confirmed by the results of students' final attestation. In 2018 35.8% of bachelor students and 80.2% of master students graduated with honours.

Providing up-to-date contents of education

The content of study programmes (working programmes of courses, educational materials) is annually renewed in response to labour market requirements, modern developments in science and pedagogics, stakeholders' needs.

Members of the teaching staff and departments, as well as students and representatives of professional community are involved in the development of study programmes.

Teaching staff

The number of teaching staff involved in the delivery of study programmes in "Philology" is sufficient for quality student training.

72% of the teaching staff hold academic degrees and titles including 19% holding Doctor's degrees.

19% of the teaching staff have been awarded by the Ministry of Science and Higher Education of the Russian Federation and by the Government of the Russian Federation.

The members of the teaching staff involved in the programme delivery regularly participate in training and retraining programmes in order to update their skills and competencies. Thus, in 2017-2018 all the members of the teaching staff underwent professional training.

Representatives of Mass Media, TV, radio, publishing houses and educational institutions of Moscow and the Moscow region are actively involved in programme delivery.

Independent assessment of knowledge

In 2018 students enrolled in educational programmes delivered by the Institute took part in the Federal Internet-exam in the Sphere of Professional Education. Participation in the Federal Internet-exam provides an independent assessment of the quality of education.

The Institute has a well-established system of internal independent assessment of the quality of teaching.

Educational resources

The infrastructure of the Institute comprises a sufficient number of adequately equipped classrooms, video facilities and a library.

Academic, support and administrative staff members of the Institute ensure the quality of the learning and teaching process.

The Institute actively uses different information systems

- Corporate email (over 400 mailboxes)
- Webinars
- Organization of the learning process
- Automation of accounting processes using 1C software
- Information system of the Institute official website

The Institute is a subscriber of Scientific e-library (www.elibrary.ru) and E-library system "IPRBooks" (www.iprbookshop.ru). Students and teachers of the Institute have access to these resources from any computer with the Internet access.

Research activity

Teachers and researchers of the Institute actively publish their works in research journals. Over the past year 641 papers have been published including:

- 154 – in journals included into the Index of leading refereed scientific journals and publications of the State Commission for Academic Degrees and Titles;
- 209 – in journals indexed in the Russian Science Citation Index;
- 4 – in journals indexed in Web of Science,
- 4 – in journals indexed in Scopus,
- 100 – in journals indexed in Google Scholar.

Some members of the teaching staff currently employed at the Institute are included into top-100 of the most cited Russian scholars (according to the Russian Science Citation Index, from 04.09.2017).

Academic mobility of students

The Institute is cooperating with a wide range of foreign partners.

In 2017-2018 academic year there were 10 incoming international exchange students at the Institute. In the same year 14 students of the Institute went to HEIs abroad as outgoing exchange students.

The Institute takes part in certain actions under Erasmus+ programme for education, training, youth and sport.

The Institute organizes students' academic mobility in cooperation with the following partners: University of Banja Luka (Bosnia and Herzegovina), University of Debrecen (Hungary), University of Milan (Italy), Hankuk University of Foreign Studies (Korea), Pusan National University (Korea), University of Belgrade (Serbia), University of West Bohemia (Czech republic), Kyoto Sangyo University (Japan), Heilongjiang International University (China), Shumen University (Bulgaria), Wsztechnica Polska University in Warsaw (Poland).

Employability of graduates

The Institute supports and guides students through their career. There is a special employment placement assistance programme.

The Institute regularly organizes meetings and consultations with employer representatives. The heads of enterprises are regularly surveyed in order to ascertain the degree of their satisfaction with the level of students' training.

According to the "Register of HEIs of Russia: monitoring of graduates' employment" (<http://vo.graduate.edu.ru>):

- 65% of graduates pursue the occupation for which they were qualified;
- 80% of bachelors graduating from the programme are employed;
- 41.853 rubles per month is the average monthly salary;
- 3 % of graduates are self-employed as individual entrepreneurs;
- Graduates from the programmes are employed in 5 regions of the Russian Federation.

International projects

The Institute holds the status of a Basic organization of the Commonwealth of Independent States (CIS) countries of teaching Russian. The Institute was granted this status on 20 November, 2013 by the Decision of CIS Council of the Heads of Government of CIS.

Under the auspices of the Ministry of Higher Education and Science of the Russian Federation the Institute implements an international volunteer project "Russian Language Ambassadors in the World" aimed at popularization of the Russian language, culture and literature in Russia and abroad, development and enhancement of interuniversity and international partnerships, promotion of the values of tolerance and maintaining cultural dialogue.

Beginning from 2017 the International Children's Camp Artek hosts the Russian language programme for international students and Russian nationals residing abroad. The programme aims for expand students' knowledge about the Russian language and the Russian culture.

The Institute takes part in EU's Erasmus+ programme, which supports cooperation in education, training, youth and sport.

Miscellaneous

Pushkin State Russian Language Institute is the member of International Association of Teachers of the Russian Language and Literature, Russian Society of Teachers of the Russian Language and Literature, Research and Methodological Association of HEIs "Russian Testing Consortium".

The Institute is a research, methodological, information and analytical centre of the Programme for promotion of the Russian language and education in Russian by the Decision of the Russian Language Council under the Government of the Russian Federation.

By the Decision of the Higher Education and Science of the Russian Federation the Institute was granted the status of the Federal Resource Centre for Cooperation for Promotion of the Russian language and education in Russian.

The institute is a member of the Association of Language Testers of Europe.

Based on the results of the Monitoring of educational activity (2017) the Institute was found to be effective. All the indicators were above the threshold values.

In 2018 the Institute was ranked 71st in the Forbes ranking of Russian higher education institutions (the Russian version). The **Forbes ranking methodology** is driven by the quality of education, student employment, post-graduate success and the number of self-employed entrepreneurs from the total graduates.

COMPLIANCE OF THE EXTERNAL REVIEW OUTCOMES WITH THE STANDARDS

STANDARD 1. Policy (goals, development strategy) and quality assurance procedures of the educational programme

Compliance with the standard: **substantial compliance**

Good practice:

There is a special unit responsible for QA policy at the Institute. The unit cooperates with deans of faculties, heads of departments and staff members responsible for quality at every department.

QA policy is systematically implemented. There are adequate and sufficient documents, which describe different aspects of the educational process and its results. The system of internal quality assurance and study programme delivery is properly established and documented based on necessary regulating documents.

All stakeholders including undergraduate and postgraduate students are involved in the assessment of quality in education.

Areas for improvement:

The Institute's administration should focus on the development of long-term strategy and the future vision by answering the question 'what the Institute will look like in 15 years'.

It is recommended to work out the strategy for extending international contacts and networks, determining priority countries to cooperate with and areas for this cooperation.

It is recommended to develop a long-term strategy of collaboration with employers, businesses, public and professional organizations.

STANDARD 2. Design and approval of programmes

Compliance with the standard: **substantial compliance**

Good practice:

The procedures of study programmes design and delivery are stipulated by the local regulatory documents of the Institute. These documents are accessible by staff members responsible for programme design.

The cluster of study programmes undergoing accreditation is properly documented: curriculum, programme description, list of competencies,

working programmes of academic courses/modules, pool of assessment tools, etc.

The goals, objectives and expected learning outcomes of study programmes are well formulated, approved, published and comply with the mission and goals of the Institute.

The content of student training is maintained relevant due to regular revision of study programmes, introducing research results obtained by the Institute staff members into educational process, expanding the master programmes cluster, inviting high-quality visiting lecturers to deliver open lectures and conducting classes.

Areas for improvement:

It is recommended to design new study programmes, which are demanded by employers (i.g. a study programme or further education programme adapted for a certain business or a professional community in Russia or abroad).

Employers should be regularly involved in design and evaluation of study programmes and assessment tools. It is necessary to use national and foreign employers' real cases in order to develop case studies and launch academic projects.

STANDARD 3. Student-centered learning and assessment

Compliance with the standard: **substantial compliance**

Good practice:

The Institute prioritizes students' interests when it comes to quality assurance in education.

Students benefit from the appeals system, transparent and open point-rating system of students' knowledge assessment, which is convenient for teachers and students.

Areas for improvement:

It is recommended to improve the system of documenting the individual learning trajectory. It should be tailor-made to fit different categories of students: persons with disabilities, students in difficult situations (students with minor children), foreign and exchange students.

It is recommended to include adapted educational methods and approaches into the working programmes of academic courses.

It is recommended to provide more opportunities for developing individual learning trajectories for students. Different tools and procedures should be used to help students understand their personal goals and objectives.

STANDARD 4. Student admission, support of academic achievements and graduation

Compliance with the standard: **substantial compliance**

Good practice:

The website of the Institute contains detailed information about the procedures of student admission (Student admission section). The faculties of the Institute offers student career guidance on a regular basis. This work aims to select talented, highly motivated applicants.

The academic progress of students is regularly monitored by the automated education management system. Students are actively involved in research, which is carried out in two forms: students' research projects supervised by the members of the teaching staff (including research projects initiated by employers), student research clubs and societies, taking part in research conferences in Russia and abroad, publishing the results of students' research works in conference proceedings.

Students' achievements are systematically collected and taken into consideration. There are certain incentive mechanisms stimulating personal growth of students and teachers, which include international academic mobility programmes and project work.

Areas for improvement:

It is recommended to expand career guidance work in order to select better applicants, attract applicants from other regions.

It is recommended to involve students in academic mobility programmes funded by EU (Erasmus +) and other grant programmes.

STANDARD 5. Teaching staff

Compliance with the standard: **full compliance**

Good practice:

The teaching staff of the Institute are highly-qualified professionals, many of them are world famous specialists and researchers. 72% of the teaching staff hold academic degrees and titles. 19% of the teaching staff hold state and ministerial awards.

Representatives of the professional community (mass media, publishing houses, educational institutions of Moscow and Moscow Region) are involved in educational process.

The Institute has in place Regulations on Effectiveness of the Teaching Staff and Researchers.

The teaching staff of the Institute are age-balanced: there are teachers with extensive experience, as well as young specialists.

The members of the teaching staff and the researchers of the Institute have developed a lot of teaching and learning materials recognized by the national and international academic community.

Innovative teaching and learning methods and distance training are widely used in the educational process.

Areas for improvement:

It is recommended to support and promote international academic mobility of the teaching staff by expanding geography, variety of academic mobility programmes and forms of participation.

It is recommended to involve more lecturers from abroad to deliver courses, academic programmes, participate in projects and grants.

It is recommended to improve the procedure of the open competitive selection of teachers and challenge the wisdom of making the members of the teaching staff undergo this procedure too often (annually).

STANDARD 6. Learning resources and student support

Compliance with the standard: **full compliance**

Good practice:

The Institute has adequate and sufficient resources and infrastructure to ensure the high quality of the educational process. Technical and administrative personnel of the institute also contribute to maintaining the high quality of the educational process.

The Institute enjoys modern innovation-driven infrastructure, which fosters introducing innovation in education and its practical implementation on the national and international levels. These include mobile apps, simulators, computer testing systems, multimedia dictionaries, interactive courses, etc.

There is an e-learning environment at the Institute which employs video-lectures, material for self-study, e-library system.

A well-developed feedback system is in place. Via this system students can take part in the management of the Institute.

The institutional infrastructure is adapted for persons with disabilities: access ramps, specially equipped toilets, sign plates for visually impaired persons, etc.

Areas for improvement:

It is recommended to improve the work of the library by providing it with academic resources and using IT in its work.

It is recommended to focus on the renovation of the building, the condition of which mismatches the ambitious objectives of the Institute.

STANDARD 7. Collection, analysis and use of information for managing the educational institution

Compliance with the standard: **substantial compliance**

Good practice:

The Automated Management System (AMS) is in place at the Institute.

Areas for improvement:

It is recommended to broaden the application of AMS by collecting and including the processed data on the teaching staff of the Institute.

It is recommended to continue the improvement of the Institute intranet. It is necessary to include a special student section with timetable, upcoming events, grant competitions and academic mobility programmes.

STANDARD 8. Public information

Compliance with the standard: **full compliance**

Good practice:

The Institute website is content-rich and efficient. It covers all the aspects of the institutional activity. The main sections include, for example, "Education", "News", "Events of the Institute". The section "Employment and Career" contains information on the vacancies available at the Institute and the announcements of career-guidance events and employment support; informs the visitors of the Institute's partners and the vacancies they offer. Besides, students can follow employment career guidance issues offered by the Institute in Vkontakte social network, social group "Student employment and career guidance at Pushkin State Russian Language Institute".

Areas for improvement:

It is recommended to intensify the work on collection and publication of actual data of the Institute's alumni, on their demand on the labour market, on requests from employers and their feedback.

It is recommended to improve the English version of the Institute website and consider the possibility of publishing information on the Institution in Chinese.

STANDARD 9. On-going monitoring and periodic assessment of the educational programmes

Compliance with the standard: **substantial compliance**

Good practice:

The Institute ensures thorough monitoring of the quality of study programmes. There is an ongoing internal independent evaluation of the quality of student training at the institute. The results of this evaluation are considered when revising and correcting the content of the study programmes.

Areas for improvement:

It is recommended to improve the work on collecting feedback from graduates and alumni and uploading this information at the Institute website. The feedback should contain data on alumni's employment, achievements and requirements, which indirectly evaluate the quality of the study programme.

STANDARD 10. Cyclical external quality assurance of the educational programmes

Compliance with the standard: **full compliance**

Good practice:

As a result of accreditation procedure underwent in 2013, the Institute management team have developed and implemented a follow-up procedure. Thus, the recommendations of experts have been taken into consideration and the corrective actions have been implemented.

As a result of the Ministerial monitoring of educational activity (2017) the institute was recognized effective with all indicators above threshold values.

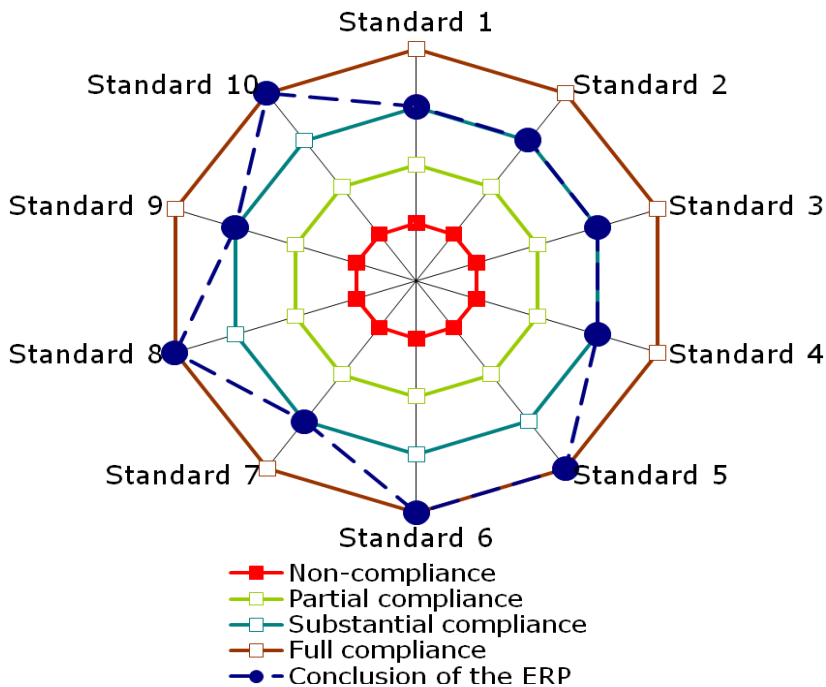
In 2018 the Institute was ranked 71st in the Forbes Ranking of the Best Russian Higher Education Institutions (the Russian version).

Areas for improvement:

It is recommended to develop the strategy and the programme of competitiveness development of the Institute, its inclusion in national and international rankings in order to improve its status and image.

It is recommended to take more active part in international accreditation procedures.

Russian as a Foreign Language and Methodology of its Teaching", "Practical Course of Russian as a Foreign Language", "Preparation of Foreign Citizens and Non-Citizens for Mastering Bachelor Degree Programmes in Russian (Humanities profile)", "Preparation of Foreign Citizens and Non-Citizens for Mastering Bachelor's Programmes in Russian (Economics profile)" **substantially comply** with the standards and criteria of public accreditation of the National Centre for Public Accreditation.

The Panel recommends that the National Accreditation Board accredit the cluster of the educational programmes "Philology" (45.03.01, 45.04.01), "Education and Pedagogical Sciences" (44.06.01), "Linguistics and Literary Studies" (45.06.01), further education programmes "Methods of Teaching Russian and a Non-Native and Foreign Language", "Summer School. Russian as a Foreign Language and Methodology of its Teaching", "Practical Course of Russian as a Foreign Language", "Preparation of Foreign Citizens and Non-Citizens for Mastering Bachelor Degree Programmes in Russian (Humanities profile)", "Preparation of Foreign Citizens and Non-Citizens for Mastering Bachelor's Programmes in Russian (Economics profile)", delivered by the Pushkin State Russian Language Institute, for the period of **6 years**.
